WELCOME

We are so glad you chose to come to Student Fusion Camp this summer. We hope this information packet will be helpful in your camp planning.

What is Student Fusion?

Student Fusion is a discipleship camp for students who have completed 7th through 12th grade. This camp includes graded Bible studies with students from other churches, recreation, and afternoon track times, all facilitated by Student Fusion camp staff.

REGISTRATION DEADLINE

Week 1: Participants must register online by Friday, June 20 or a \$20 late fee will be applied

Week 2: Participants must register online by Friday, June 27 or a \$20 late fee will be applied

**Registration is not complete until the final balance has been paid*

Students and **Adult Volunteers** should register online at www.scbi.org/studentfusion. This year the Medical Release Forms are to be completed online during the registration process. **Every participant** must complete a Medical Release Form.

All Adult Volunteers will need to complete an Adult Volunteer Form that is also available in the registration portal. *****Adult volunteers without completed Volunteer Screening Forms will not be permitted to attend Student Fusion. This**

policy is to ensure the safety and security of SCBI camp where children 18 and under are present.

How Many Adult Volunteer Chaperones Does a Church Need to Provide?

The required student to adult ratio is as follows:

In order to provide the best atmosphere and supervision, we ask that all groups bring **one male sponsor for every seven boys** and **one female sponsor for every seven girls**. If your group is unable to provide a particular sponsor, please call the state convention office at 317-481-2400 extension 246.

ON-SITE REGISTRATION

Registration check in will take place on Monday, between 1-4 p.m.

When your group arrives, the Group Leader will bring the following forms to the Welcome Center to check the group in:

*All medications (prescription and non-prescription) should be brought by adults or students (**original container** must be placed in a Ziploc bag labeled with camper's name and church, along with the proper dosing schedule) to the registration area upon arrival. The camp nurse will be there to receive those medications.

*You should not have to bring payment with you unless you have changes at the last minute as payments are due prior to arrival at camp.

- Please note that this may result in additional fees.

*Students and additional volunteers from your church should proceed to the cafeteria to sign up for the Track Times they would like to participate in while at camp. They will be asked to sign up for both Track A and Track B. Their selected options will be communicated after assignments have been made.

DIRECTIONS

Highland Lakes Baptist Camp is located on State Road 39. The camp entrance is four miles south of Monrovia or four miles north of State Highway 67. Take Interstate I-70 to exit 59 (14 miles west of the I-70 and I-465 exchange at the Indianapolis Airport).

Take State Road 39 south six miles. Highway 39 makes a jog at the intersection in Monrovia. The camp entrance is on the left 1/2 mile south of the white water tower.

CAMP LEADERSHIP

CAMP PASTOR WEEK 2 – Alan Findley

Alan's heart is about seeing people authentically fall in love with the God who has loved them all along. He has worked with teenagers for the last 15 years as a student-leader, volunteer, and on staff at several churches in Missouri. Aside from seeing students catch the fire of the gospel, some of Alan's passions include pogo-sticking, playing guitar, reading and hanging out with his family. He and his wife, Mary, have three kids: Titus (5), Silas (3) and Addison (1).

CAMP WORSHIP LEADER WEEK 2 – Jake Brothers

A graduate of Anderson University, Brothers studied Music Business while leading worship for Campus Crusade for Christ and Open Door ministry. Brothers also traveled the Midwest with a band and sparked interest in performing. Jake's music style reveals his passion to worship the one true God in a fresh way. With influences of hymns, pop and artists like Chris Tomlin and David Crowder Band,

Brothers' music is noted for its true lyrics that are easy to sing and easily get stuck in your head. Brothers' has led worship for Faith Church in Indianapolis since 2003. He is heavily involved with the youth programs, especially high school ministry. Brothers' passion for missions has allowed him to bring his worship music to half a dozen countries on three continents for the last seven years to crowds of ten or ten thousand.

DRESS CODE

Make sure your students do NOT pack anything that:

- Advertises alcohol, tobacco, illegal drugs
- Explicitly or implicitly promotes racism, sexism, or hatred of any group or person
- Explicitly or implicitly refers to sexual actions or situations
- Has spaghetti straps or is sleeveless, except for sleepwear/swimwear
- All shirts must have sleeves
- Is excessively short or tight fitting.

While at camp, we ask that students:

- Wear modest, one-piece bathing suits or two-piece suits covered with a dark colored t-shirt.
- Wear sleeved t-shirts (no tank-tops) and modest shorts (when hands are extended to the back or the front, finger tips must touch fabric).
- Wear modest shorts, dresses, slacks, and jeans for worship. Long pants or knee length skirts are required for students or adults participating in worship on stage
- Do not dress in a way that calls attention to underwear (sagging your pants, rolling down your waistbands, etc.)

*We invite you to join us as leaders in monitoring your group to ensure students are dressing appropriately.

WHAT TO BRING

- Linens, towels, pillows, blankets or sleeping bag
- Water bottle that you can refill and carry with you
- Closed-toe, closed-heel shoes (for outdoor activities and recreation)
- Bible, notepad, and pen
- Toiletries such as soap, toothpaste, toothbrush, shampoo, etc. Sun protection
- Spending money for snacks, camp store, and missions offering (optional)
- **DO NOT BRING** alcohol, tobacco, illegal drugs, fireworks, water guns, or any kind of weapon

- **DO NOT BRING** radios, iPods, CD players, play station portables or other gaming devices, roller blades, skateboards – **if students bring cell phones, please make sure it is not a distraction at camp (suggestion: only allow use of cell phones during Hang Times).**

DAMAGES

Please be aware that your group is personally responsible for damages to any facilities including but not limited to the cabins your group occupies.

Share the following outline with your students before they leave for camp so they will have a heads up about the theme and daily study. You may want to use this outline for devotions leading up to camp.

BIBLE STUDY OVERVIEW

The Convergence

Two Paths. Choose One.

A study on the Life of David and Making Godly Decisions

Theme Verse:

“Make Your ways known to me, Lord; teach me Your paths. Guide me in Your truth and teach me, for You are the God of my salvation; I wait for You all day long.” Psalm 25:4-5

Theme Paragraph:

We are all on a journey, often finding ourselves standing at the convergence of truth and its imitation. These convergent moments have the power to alter our lives and impact God’s Kingdom for eternity. But, how do we decide in which direction to move? Studying the journey of David, students will be challenged to apply godly discernment by trusting God completely, recognize the difference between God’s truth and men’s advice, realize the impact of their decisions and surround themselves with people who reinforce the need for godly wisdom. Join us on the journey.

Opening Night

Introduction - Samuel anoints David – God chose David. 1 Samuel 16:1-3

Day 1

Point of Inception : David and Goliath

Teaching Aim: Students will learn that in order to have holy discernment you must first have a relationship with God, through Christ. The relationship is the foundation for David's trust and reliance on the Lord.

Scripture: 1 Samuel 17:26-51

Key Verse: Psalm 62:1-2

Life Question: How do I define my relationship with the Lord? Where is my trust found in decision making?

Day 2

Point of Truth: David and Saul

Teaching Aim: Students will be challenged to discern what is justifiable and what is God's truth. Students will learn how to make lasting Christ-like decisions concerning what is right versus what is easy.

Scripture: 1 Samuel 24: 1-15

Key Verse: Psalm 111:10

Life Question: How do I make choices based on God's truth when other choices seem justifiable?

Day 3

Point of Reconciliation: David and Nathan

Teaching Aim: Students will see how David's poor decision led to God's discipline which developed character. Students will be reminded of the hope for reconciliation in spite of bad decisions.

Scripture: 2 Samuel 11:1-5, 14-15, 26; 12:1 – 10, 13-14, 20

Key Verse: Psalm 31:4-5

Life Question: Do I have to carry this guilt around forever? Do poor decisions keep me from reconciliation with God?

Day 4

Point of Connection: David and Jonathan

Teaching Aim: Students will discover the role of community and the importance of accountability and mentorship in holy discernment. Students will see this by looking at David's relationship with Jonathan and Nathan.

Scripture: 1 Samuel 18:1, 3-4; 19:1-7 (Reference back to 2 Samuel 12:1 – 7, 11-13, 20 from Day 3 for Nathan)

Key Verse: Psalm 133:1

Life Question: How do the people in my life influence my decisions?

SPECIAL NEEDS REQUESTS

The State Convention of Baptists in Indiana takes the special needs of students and adults seriously. Meeting your needs and setting up your group for a great week of camp is important to us. While we understand that the spiritual need for your students is great, we would like to specifically know about physical and emotional needs. These needs include but are not limited to wheelchair accessibility, hearing/sight impairment, food allergies, etc.

If your student's need should be known by our camp staff at camp, you will have the option of completing a "Special Attention Card" for your student so this need can be addressed by the camp staff. You can print and fill out this card before camp, or you can fill it out on registration day at camp. You can find a copy of this card in the Appendix of this document.

LATE NIGHT

We don't want to ruin the surprise by telling you too much, but there are a couple of themed LATE NIGHTS.

Monday Night: *DECODE* - A mysterious "Amazing Race" type experience where students race the clock to "decode" the secret messages of East Asian influence. Students will try to be the first to crack the code before time ends. Dress in dark clothing and wear spy gear.

Tuesday Night: *DECIDE* - A contemplative prayer experience where students pray for the nations while traveling to 6 different stations on campus by their decisions. Eventually, they will come to the decision point: In what way will I help further the message of Jesus Christ? Or will I not?

Wednesday Night: *VARIETY SHOW*: Students come ready to try out for the variety show! Tryouts will be held on Tuesday during afternoon free time.

Thursday Night (or afternoon): *MEGA RELAY*: Get your game faces on and come ready to compete for the FUGE Cup!

MISSIONS OFFERING

On Thursday a special offering will be taken as we support special projects with the International Mission Board and North American Mission Board.

EAST ASIA

CHURCH ADULT VOLUNTEER/SPONSOR QUALIFICATIONS

In order to provide the best atmosphere and supervision, we ask that **all groups bring one male sponsor for every seven boys, and one female sponsor for every seven girls.**

- All Adult Volunteers must be at least 19 years old. Basically, someone who has been out of high school for at least one year. We encourage each church to select these sponsors at their own discretion.
- **All Adult Volunteers** will need to complete an Adult Volunteer Form that is available in the registration portal. ***Adult volunteers without completed Volunteer Screening Forms will not be permitted to attend Student Fusion. This policy is to ensure the safety and security of SCBI camp where children 18 and under are present.
- Aid in monitoring the dress code of your students.
- Encourage participation and promptness by setting an example.

CHURCH GROUP DEVOTIONS

Church Group Devotion is a time for each church group to be together in the evenings to debrief the day. This time usually lasts one hour. The group leader needs to determine what should be discussed or taught. Devotions are provided by Lifeway's Centrifuge for this time. They can be downloaded from the www.scbi.org web site on the Student Fusion event page. **Print this and bring it to camp with you, if you choose to use it.**

Parent Devotions are also available online. This resource is for you to give parents so they know what students are learning in Bible study.

AFTER CAMP BIBLE STUDY & QUIET TIME

An After Camp Bible Study, written by Lifeway's Centrifuge, designed to follow the camp experience.
