### **What is Student Fusion?**

Student Fusion is a discipleship camp for students who have completed 7<sup>th</sup> through 12<sup>th</sup> grade. At Student Fusion, students are divided into groups for recreation and Bible study based on age ranges by grade completed. Recreation is facilitated within Bible study groups by a member of our camp staff, who also leads the Bible study. Each activity serves a specific purpose and is debriefed so students can make application in their lives.

Students also participate in activities. These activities are created to give students the opportunity to participate in something with which they are familiar or try something new! Students will select these activities through the registration process. We offer creative, active, performance, and classroom-based activities during these times.

**Students** and **Adult Volunteers** must register online at [www.scbi.org/events/student-fusion/](http://www.scbi.org/events/student-fusion/). Medical Release Forms are to be completed online during the registration process. **Every participant** must complete a Medical Release Form.

**All Adult Volunteers** will need to complete 3 key requirements in order to come to camp with students. Registration is not complete without completing the following:

1. ADULT VOLUNTEER SCREENING FORM WITH PASTOR CONFIRMATION of a valid background check having been done and on file at the church.
2. WATCH CHURCH MUTUAL'S PREVENTING ABUSE VIDEO
3. READ HIGHLAND LAKES CAMP'S POLICIES AND PROCEDURES MANUAL, SOCIAL MEDIA POLICY, & CODE OF CONDUCT and sign off online at registration

**\*\*\*Adult volunteers who have not completed these 3 requirements will not be permitted to attend Student Fusion. This policy is to ensure the safety and security of SCBI camps where children 18 and under are present.**

### How Many Adult Volunteer Chaperones Does a Church Need to Provide?

**The required student to adult ratio is as follows:** In order to provide the best atmosphere and supervision, we ask that all groups bring **one male sponsor for every seven boys** and **one female sponsor for every seven girls**. If you have fewer than 7 we still ask that you provide a chaperone.

## **ON-SITE CHECK-IN**

Check in will take place on Monday, between 1-4 p.m.

When your group arrives, the Group Leader will bring the following to the Welcome Center to check the group in:

**\*\*All medications (prescription and non-prescription) should be brought by adults or students (original container must be placed in a Ziploc bag labeled with camper's name and church, along with the proper dosing schedule) to the nurses' station in the welcome lodge upon arrival. The camp nurse will be there to receive those medications.**

\*Your students should not have to bring payment with them unless they have changes at the last minute as payments are due prior to arrival at camp. Please note that this may result in additional fees.

### **DIRECTIONS**

Highland Lakes Baptist Camp is located on State Road 39. The camp entrance is four miles south of Monrovia or four miles north of State Highway 67. Take Interstate I-70 to exit 59 (14 miles west of the I-70 and I-465 exchange at the Indianapolis Airport).

Take State Road 39 south six miles. Highway 39 makes a jog at the intersection in Monrovia. The camp entrance is on the left 1/2 mile south of the white water tower.

## **DRESS CODE**

### **Students are NOT to pack anything that:**

- Advertises alcohol, tobacco, or illegal drugs.
- Explicitly or implicitly promotes racism, sexism, or hatred of any group or person.
- Explicitly or implicitly refers to sexual actions or situations.
- Has spaghetti/small straps or open back, except for sleepwear.
- Is excessively short or tight fitting.

### **While at camp, we ask that students:**

- Wear modest shorts (when hands are extended to the back or the front, fingertips must touch fabric).
- Sleeveless shirts and tank tops are now allowed during day-time activities. Shirts with spaghetti straps, open backs or excessive armpit cutouts which exposed torso and undergarments are NOT allowed.
- Wear closed-toe and closed-heel shoes while at recreation and track times and during Mega Relay.
- Wear modest, one-piece bathing suits or two-piece suits covered with a dark colored t-shirt, if participating in water activities.
- Do not dress in a way that calls attention to underwear (sagging your pants, rolling down your waistbands, etc.) or wear pants or shorts with lettering on the bottom.

**NOTE: Adult leaders have the responsibility of modeling and monitoring their group to ensure students are dressing appropriately.**

## WHAT TO BRING

- Linens, towels, pillows, blankets or sleeping bag
- Water bottle that you can refill and carry with you
- Closed-toe, closed-heel shoes (for outdoor activities and recreation)
- Bible, notepad, and pen
- Toiletries such as soap, toothpaste, toothbrush, shampoo, sun protection, etc.
- Spending money for snacks, camp store, and missions offering (optional)

-Masks – for when needed

- **DO NOT BRING** Alcohol, tobacco, e-cigarettes, illegal drugs, fireworks, water guns, or any kind of weapon • We recommend no iPads, iPods, PlayStation portables or other gaming devices, roller blades or skateboards. **If students bring cell phones or other electronics, they are not to be out and in use during programming elements: morning celebration, Bible study, worship, night life, recreation and track times / ministry tracks.**
- Pranks are not allowed at camp. **Your church will be charged for any damages or issues related to clean up.**

## CAMP RULES:

### CELL PHONES

- The decision of cell phone usage at camp is in the hands of the Group Leader of each church.
- Unless instructed by staff, students with cell phones are not allowed to have them out or in use during programming elements: Morning Celebration, Bible Study, Worship, Night Life, Recreation and Track Times/Ministry Tracks. Ringers should be turned to silent or vibrate.
- \*No tolerance- Students are not permitted to take photos in the cabins or pool shower house.

### ACTIVITIES

- Participate in all activities and be on time.
- Drink plenty of water and eat three meals a day.
- Wear closed-toe and closed-heel shoes to recreation and ministry sites.
- Wear nametag at all times.

### HOUSING

- Be in rooms by 10:45 PM with lights out no later than 11:30 PM.
- No guys in girls' rooms or hallways and no girls in guys' rooms or hallways.
- No public displays of affection.
- No practical jokes.

### WORSHIP

Because we desire worship to be reverent and distraction free, we request:

- No gum, food, or drinks in the worship center.

## MISSIONS OFFERING

Every summer at Student Fusion, we collect a mission offering. That offering is collected at other Centrifuge locations and at the end of the summer is distributed between the International Mission Board (IMB), and the North American Mission Board (NAMB). We will be collecting an offering on Thursday night during the evening worship service. Students and Youth Groups will also be able to bid on Creative Paintings to bring home. All money raised will be added to our missions offering for the week.

## International Mission Board (IMB)



The Americas are home to over 550 million people living without Jesus. From Mexico, through Central America, the Caribbean and South America there are over 1,000 distinct people groups. More than 300 of those people groups are unreached with the gospel and 174 are unreached and unengaged with the gospel. That means there are 174 identified people groups with no access to the truth of Jesus, where no missionary or church is working to share the gospel. This summer, FUGE Campers will learn about the Americas.

## North American Mission Board (NAMB) – Pittsburgh Neighborhood Outreach



Everything that Pittsburgh is, Mount Washington is. Old and new, rich and poor, passed-down-thru-generations and just-moved-here—somehow it seems fitting that Mount Washington, an eclectic neighborhood southwest of the city, would be the place tourists come when they're looking for an iconic, picture-postcard view of downtown Pittsburgh. This is, after all, also the place where old Catholic churches and wealthy house flippers and homeless families all coexist side by side. Mount Washington is as "Pittsburgh" as it gets.

Several years ago, North American Mission Board missionaries launched a neighborhood ministry center in Mount Washington and started a new church. Now, when struggling families in Mount Washington come to the ministry center looking for help, missionaries and volunteers there help them with food, clothing, and other basics of life, while missionaries and volunteers at what is now called Vintage Church teach them about Jesus. As a result, many people in Mount Washington are hearing the gospel for the very first time. One woman who recently gave her life to Christ after receiving help at the center and then visiting Vintage Church, said, "I'd never known you could have this kind of relationship with Christ. But I found joy and peace right here."

When you give to the FUGE Camps Missions Offering, your gifts will go to meet needs and change lives in cities like Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, through the work of missionaries like Rob Wilton and Vintage Church. Pray that lives will be changed in this community and that volunteers and church workers in Mount Washington will have everything they need to love their neighbors. **3Circles** - This track will empower students to turn everyday conversations into gospel conversations using the simple 3 Circles tool. The goal is for students to understand the responsibility of evangelism; to be able to regularly and repeatedly incorporate an evangelistic mindset.

**Crafts** – Who doesn't love making neat crafts? Learn a new hobby, different techniques, or sharpen your skills as you make a keepsake that will remind you of summer camp throughout the year.

**Creative Movement** - Participants will learn a creative movement/dance routine (\*performance optional on final day).

**Creative Painting** – Students will use paint and canvas to create a masterpiece! Paintings will be sold at the end of the week for missions.

**Drama** – Participants will learn the basics of drama, improvisation, mime, etc. Students will rehearse a drama and will be provided with resources for how to begin a drama ministry at home (\*performance optional on final day).

**For Girls Only** - This track will walk girls through a journey to discover where they get their identity from. The material covered in this track is yet to be determined.

**Frisbee Games** - Campers will participate in disc golf, ultimate Frisbee, and miscellaneous Frisbee games.

**Hiking** - Get ready to get into the great outdoors! Grab your closed toe shoes and a water bottle and let's hit the trails.

**Lawn Games** - This track has a little bit of everything! Kickball, Battleball (dodge ball on steroids!!!) and Lawn Games like Spikeball, Gaga Ball, and etc.

**Marksmanship (Archery/Rifery/Hatchet)** - Whether you think of yourself as a modern day Robin Hood or Willie Robertson from Duck Dynasty, it is important to learn how to safely and effectively throw a hatchet, shoot a bow or rifle. Have a "blast" as you aim and "shoot" at targets during this "action" packed track time.

**Sports Recreation** - Campers will participate in basketball, soccer, and volleyball throughout the three days of track times.

**Percussion/World Drumming**- Students will learn how to read rhythm charts and will practice patterns and rhythm. Using trash cans, buckets, and other "found" percussion instruments, students will perform a "Stomp" style piece during closing celebration. Beginners and experienced drummers are welcome.

**Pickleball** – Pickleball is the fastest-growing sport in America! Learn how to play this fun sport that combines many elements of tennis, badminton and ping-pong. The rules are simple and the game is easy for beginners to learn.

**Practical MISSIONS A or B** - This track will allow students to work on a missions project around the camp. They will meet with a mission coordinator to plan and implement their mission project for the week. Students will learn how to practically apply missions at home, in their church, and around their community.

**Table Games** - Students will have the opportunity to play a variety of fun board and card games including checkers, dominoes, UNO, Monopoly and many others.

**The Man Track** - This track will give guys practical "how tos" on understanding their identity and modeling it positively. The material covered in this track is yet to be determined.

**Worship Team** - Students will meet with the worship band for the week and learn how to lead worship. (If you'd like to use your instrument, please bring it with you and make a joyful noise!) (\*performance optional on final day).

**Water Sports** - Campers will play wild and crazy games in the pool. Campers taking this track must have a one-piece bathing suit and know how to swim.

# CAMP BIBLE STUDY

Share the following outline with your camper before they leave for camp so they will have a heads up about the theme and daily study. You may want to use this outline for devotions leading up to camp.

## BIBLE STUDY OVERVIEW

### Matchless One

The Bible is filled with stories of ordinary people God used in extraordinary ways to teach character and truth. Through Isaac's life, we learn about sacrifice. Joseph's life shows us the hard-fought beauty of forgiveness and reconciliation. Abraham's story teaches us about obedience and forgiveness. From Esther, we learn how to be bold and courageous and take risks. One person in Scripture is the full and complete embodiment of every good trait any other character ever displayed - Jesus. He is the MATCHLESS ONE. Join us for FUGE Camps 2022 as we study the lives of these well-known Old Testament characters and see the story of Jesus foreshadowed in their lives.

#### Day 1 – Matchless Sacrifice

THE GRAND NARRATIVE – ISAAC & JESUS

**Scripture:** Genesis 22:1-14, Leviticus 4:27-35, Mark 15:21-37

**Life questions:** How does Jesus' death on the cross for your sins impact your life? What does living sacrificially for Christ mean and how can I live it out? Abraham was ready to sacrifice his son, Isaac but God provided a ram. The priests were required to make sacrifices for the sins of the people. These were foreshadowing of the sacrifice God provided in Jesus' death on the cross for the sins of humankind. We must live sacrificially for Christ.

#### Day 2 – Matchless Forgiveness

THE GRAND NARRATIVE – JOSEPH & JESUS

**Scripture:** Genesis 37:3-4, 18-28; 39:1-6; 41:46-49, 53-57; 42:1-26; 45:1-14, John 20:1-18

**Life questions:** When were you reconciled to God through Christ, receiving forgiveness for your sins? Who do you know who needs the forgiveness of Christ in his or her life? Joseph was abandoned and sold into slavery by his brothers but God used that to provide for His people and worked through Joseph to show forgiveness to his brothers. Jesus came to earth to bring forgiveness. Through His resurrection from the dead, Jesus reconciled us to the Father, covering our sin and redeeming us so that we can have a relationship with the Father. We must accept the forgiveness of Christ and be willing to forgive ourselves and others.

#### Day 3 – Matchless Obedience

THE GRAND NARRATIVE – ABRAHAM & JESUS

**Scripture:** Genesis 11:31-12:1-9, Genesis 15:1-21, Luke 4:1-13

**Life Questions:** How have you been obedient to God's leading in your life? How can you remain faithful to Him in the future? Abraham followed God's plan and left his life as he knew it to relocate his family to Canaan. Even though Abraham was old with no children, because of his obedience, God established a covenant with him that his descendants would become a great nation. Jesus was obedient to God's leading in His life. When Satan tempted him in the desert, he remained true to God. And, He resolved to live a perfect life on earth, to die on the cross and be raised again for the salvation of all mankind. We must be obedient and remain faithful to God's working in our lives.

#### Day 4 – Matchless Risk

THE GRAND NARRATIVE – ESTHER & JESUS

**Scripture:** Esther 2:5-10, 15-18; 5:1-8; 8:1-13, Luke 4:31-36, Luke 19:45-48
